## Lagrein Roblinus de' Waldgries

This wine is named after the first documented owner of Ansitz Waldgries. That is why you can find the year 1242 on the label.

Unfortunately, we know nothing about Roblinus de' Waldgries except for his name. Nearly 800 years later, Christian Plattner continues his work: making wines and preserving the Ansitz. One day, he had the idea of crafting a wine that honours Roblinus and would please him. Christian wanted to extract the maximum potential from the Lagrein grape. To create a wine that is dense and concentrated, yet delicate and elegant, unlike anything before. He only produces Roblinus de' Waldgries in exceptional vintages.

## Winemaker note:

"The grapes for this wine come from our oldest vines with the lowest yields and highest quality. The maceration period lasts up to five weeks, sometimes including stems. Afterwards, the wine ages in barriques. Roblinus de' Waldgries is released for sale only after it has matured for three years."


Aging Dark and cool (approx. 12-14°C) with minimum temperature fluctuations

Eye: deep purple

Nice to know: The Waldgries estate can be traced back to the 13th century and is mentioned in a document dated 1248. At that time Roblinus de' Waldgries was the first owner. Today he gives his name to this exceptional cru, which first came on the market in the 2011 vintage. It will only be bottled for selected vintages.
